Photograph licensing

Congleton Museum holds thousands of high-quality historical images from Congleton and the surrounding areas. The archive holds images of buildings, landscapes, industry, people, landmarks, festivals, and so much more.

There are two types of licences that you can apply for: private and commercial.

Private license

A private license enables you to purchase copies of photographs in our collection for personal use. For example, to hang on your wall in your home. The license includes a **20minute one-to-one viewing session** with a member of staff so that you can choose your images. Please let us know before your viewing session if there is a particular theme/event that you would like to see so that we can prepare.

The cost of a private license is £5 per image. This includes 1 digital 600dpi copy.

Prints (optional)

A4 - £6 unmounted, £7.50 mounted (in addition to private license)

A3 - £8 unmounted, £10 mounted (in addition to private license)

Commercial license

A commercial license enables you to purchase high-quality copies of photographs in our collection, up to **1200dpi**, for commercial purposes. For example, in publications. The license includes a **60-minute one-to-one viewing session** with a member of staff so that you can choose your images. Please let us know before your viewing session if there is a particular theme/event that you would like to see so that we can prepare.

This is a bespoke service and cost is dependent on what the images are for, how long they will be used for etc...

Once you have chosen your images, you will be given a quote. Please note that you do not have to decide on your images at the viewing session.

The images chosen can only be used for purposes specified in your bespoke quote.
